We have at least 4 clinicians – this can be GP, registrar or advanced nursing practitioner with 10 appointments each daily. These need to be booked by calling the surgery at 8am or online.

We have 50+ appointments that are pre-bookable daily. These can be booked by calling the surgery or online. You can also use the accurx texting service for queries and non-urgent issues.

We also have daily appointments with our nurses, health care assistants and phlebotomist which can all be booked in advance.

The following table shows 7 conditions pharmacists can also manage across various age ranges.
